## 1. Introduction

Micro, Small & Medium Enterprises (MSME) Department was carved out from Industries Department on 19<sup>th</sup> December, 2011 with a mandate to promote of MSMEs including Khadi & Village Industries, Coir Industries and Salt Industries in the state. The Department is functioning since 2012-13.

Following organizations are working under the administrative control of the Department to provide support services for development of these sectors.

- i. Directorate of Industries (DI)
- ii. Directorate of Export Promotion & Marketing (DEPM)
- iii. Orissa State Financial Corporation (OSFC)

## 2. Policy formulation with benefit realized so far

## 2.1 <u>Industrial Policy Resolution</u>

IPR, 2015, containing following provisions of State support for MSME Sector, is in operation since 24.08.2015.

- a) Land & Shed
  - Land at concessional rate
- b) Exemption of premium on conversion of agriculture land for industrial purpose.

- One-time reimbursement of cost of Energy Audit (Rs.1 lakh for micro; Rs.2 lakh for small & Rs.3 lakh for medium enterprises)

#### f) VAT Reimbursement

- New Micro & Small and Medium Enterprises 75% VAT paid for 5 years limited 100% of cost of plant & machinery
- New Industrial units in priority sector 100% VAT paid for 7 years limited 200% of cost of plant & machinery
- Existing MSMEs taking up E / M / D 75% VAT paid for 5 years limited 100% of cost of plant & machinery for E / M/ D
- Existing MSMEs in priority sector taking up E / M / D 100% VAT paid for 7 years limited 200% of cost of plant & machinery for E / M/ D
- New Pioneer units in each priority sector 100% VAT paid for 9 years limited 200% of cost of plant & machinery

## g) Entry Tax

- 100% Entry Tax Exemption on Plant & Machinery new MSMEs & Priority
   Sector units and existing MSMEs & Priority Sector units taking up E/M/D
- 100% Entry Tax Exemption on Raw material
  - 5 years for new MSMEs & Priority Sector units limited to 100% cost of plant & machinery
  - 5 years for existing MSMEs & Priority Sector units taking up E/M/D limited to 100% cost of additional plant & machinery
  - 7 years for new Pioneer units in each priority sector limited to 100% cost of plant & machinery

## h) Entertainment Tax

- 100% of ET paid for 5 years for new multiplex Cinema Hall with at least 3 screen & minimum capital investment of Rs.3 crore
- 100% of ET paid for 5 years for existing Cinema Hall upgradaded to multiplex with minimum capital investment of Rs.1 crore

#### i) Employment Cost Subsidy

- 75% (for male workers) & 100% (for female workers) of contribution for ESI & EPF for 5 years (New & existing units taking up E/M/D in Micro and Small sector) & 3 years (New & existing units taking up E/M/D in Medium sector)
- 100% (for project displaced) of contribution for ESI & EPF for 3 years (New & existing units taking up E/M/D in MSMEs
- 100% (for persons with disability) of contribution for ESI & EPF for 3 years
   (New & existing units taking up E/M/D in MSMEs
- Additional 2 years subsidy for Industrially Backward districts

- j) Assistance for Patent Registration
  - 100% of registration cost limited to Rs.10 lakh for new MSMEs, existing MSMEs taking up E /M/D & units in priority sector
- k) Assistance for Quality Certification & renewal for next 2 years
  - 100% of quality certification charges total limited to Rs.3 lakh for new MSMEs, existing MSMEs taking up E /M/D & units in priority sector
- 1) Assistance for Technical Know- how to new MSME & priority sector units
  - 100% of cost of Indigenous Technology upto Rs.1 lakh
  - 100% of cost of Imported Technology up to Rs.5 lakh
- 1) Entrepreneurship Development Subsidy
  - 75% of course fee limited to Rs.50,000/- to budding entrepreneurs to undergo
     Management Development Training at reputed national level institution
- 1) Environmental Protection Infrastructure Subsidy
  - 20% of capital cost for Effluent Treatment Plant or Rs.20 lakh, whichever is less, for MSMEs adopting Zero Effluent or Waste Water Discharge

## 2.2 <u>Micro, Small & Medium Enterprises Development (MSMED)</u> <u>Policy</u>

MSMED Policy, 2016, containing following provisions of State support for MSME Sector, is in operation from 24.11.2016.

- a) Capital Investment Subsidy
  - 25% of capital investment made in Plant & Machinery subject to an upper limit of Rs.1 crore for New Micro & Small Enterprises
  - 30% of capital investment made in Plant & Machinery subject to an upper limit of Rs.1.25 crore for New Micro & Small Enterprises owned by SC, ST, Differently abled, Women & Technical entrepreneur
  - Additional capital investment subsidy @ 5% of investment made in Plant & Machinery for New Micro & Small Enterprises set up in industrially backward districts including KBK districts
  - Additional capital investment subsidy @ 5% of capital investment made in Plant & Machinery subject to an upper limit of Rs.10 lakh over and above the limits specified for New Micro & Small Enterprises engaged in recycling of E-waste, Hospital waste, Construction & demolition waste
- b) Seed Capital Assistance
  - One time grant @ 10% of Term Loan limiting to Rs.15 lakh to 1<sup>st</sup> generation Women, SC, ST, differently abled entrepreneurs in Industrially Backward Districts including KBK

## c) Project Cost Subsidy

 New micro enterprises entitled to a one time grant up to 2% of the project cost (up to Rs.50,000/-) for preparing detailed feasibility / project report to access finance from banks/ FIs

#### d) Water Conservation Incentive

 MSMEs undertaking water conservation measures shall receive a onetime reimbursement of 50% of audit cost by approved agencies up to Rs.25,000/-

## e) Financial Mobilisation Incentive

 New Small & Medium Enterprises entitled to one time grant @20% of expenditure incurred for raising capital through SME Exchange up to Rs.10 lakh after successfully raising equity as per the scheme approved by SME Exchange

## f) Trade Mark Assistance

 New MSMEs entitled to reimbursement of 50% of expenditure incurred in obtaining Trade Mark up to Rs.25,000/-

## f) Skill Development Incentive

 Reimbursement 50% of cost of skill up gradation & training of local manpower limited to Rs.3000/- per person (with additional Rs. 1000/per woman trainee) for a maximum of 10 persons in Micro and 20 persons in SMEs

## 2.3 Odisha Food Processing Policy

OFP Policy, 2016, containing following provisions of State support for food processing Sector, is in operation from 24.11.2016.

## a) Capital Investment Subsidy

- 25% of capital investment in Plant & Machinery limiting to Rs.2 crore for General area
- 33% of capital investment in Plant & Machinery limiting to Rs.3 crore for SC / ST / Women / Industrially Backward districts including KBK

## b) Assistance for Food Testing Laboratories

 50% of investment in Plant & Machinery limiting to Rs.4 crore for Stateof-the Art NABL accredited Food Testing Laboratory in PPP mode

- c) Assistance for Reefer Vehicles
  - 35% of the cost of standalone New Reefer Vehicle(s) / Mobile precooling van (s) limiting to Rs.25.00 lakh towards assistance for Reefer Vehicle
- d) Modernization of Meat Shops through Urban Local Bodies
  - 35% of the cost of Machinery / Equipment and Technical Civil Works limiting to Rs.5.00 lakh for in general area
  - 50% of the cost of Machinery / Equipment and Technical Civil Works limiting to Rs.5 lakh Industrially Backward Districts including KBK districts

## 2.4 **Startup Policy**

Startup Policy, 2016 is in operation from 29.08.2016. Revised Operational Guidelines (OGs) for the Policy notified on 01.05.2017. IED, Odisha has been declared Nodal Agency for implementation of the policy.

Recognised Startups are provided following supports under the said policy.

- Monthly allowance of Rs.20,000/-( the amount shall be Rs 22000/- if the Start up founder(s)/ co-founder(s) are women or transgender or from social categories such as SC/ST/SEB/ PH in such a case woman or transgender or SC/ST/SEB/ PH should have atleast 50 % equity in the start up entity) for one year
- Product development and Marketing assistance of Rs.15 lakh (the amount shall be Rs 16 Lakh if the Start up founder(s)/ co-founder(s) are women or transgender or from social categories such as SC/ST/SEB/ PH in such a case woman or transgender or SC/ST/SEB/ PH should have atleast 50 % equity in the start up entity&
- Need based assistance towards cost of raw material / component & other related equipment on case to case basis.
- So far, 203 start ups are registered with startup Odisha incubator and 24 of them have been provided assistance. Besides 5 incubators are recognized under the initiative)

## 3. Activities Report of D.I(O), Cuttack.

## 3.1 Motivational Campaigns & Entrepreneurship Development Programme

2997 motivational camps have been organised across the state to motivate youth for setting up MSMEs during last three years including 840 motivational campaigns during 2017-18. 20,049 youths have been provided entrepreneurship training under Entrepreneurship Development Programmes during last three years including training of 10,637 youth during 2017-18. Besides, a link for 4 week online Learning and Development (L&D) course on Entrepreneurship free of charge has been provided on the www.startupodisha.gov.in portal for the benefit of budding entrepreneurs / youth.

## 3.2 MSMEs Gone into Production

3,22,011 Micro, Small and Medium enterprises have been established with an investment of Rs.15905 crore and employment generation to 13.20 lakh persons till March, 2018. 50,141 MSMEs have gone into production with investment of Rs. 2270 crore and generating employment of 1,46,680 persons during 2017-18.

## 3.3 Investment Promotion

In order to facilitate fast project clearance for MSMEs and assist District Level Single Window Clearance Authority (DLSWCA), District Level Facilitation Cell (DLFC) in all the districts was set up in the year 2014-15. DLSWCAs have so far cleared 542 projects with proposed investment of Rs.2040 crore and direct employment to 21,730 persons. 232 projects with proposed investment of Rs.907.99 crore to generate 9,742 employment of have been approved at District level during 2017-18.

# 3.4 <u>Implementation of Prime Minister Employment Generation Programme</u> (PMEGP)

Prime Minister's Employment General Programme (PMEGP) is being implemented in the State since 2008-09 by three implementing agencies such as DIC, OK&VIB & KVIC. The achievement for during last three years till February, 2018 is as follows.

## 3.6 Youth Innovation Fund Scheme

YIF Scheme envisages promotion of need-based, simple, cost effective and sustainable innovations through technological solutions and development of successful business models. Scheme supports:

- Rs. 50,000 for any new idea
- Rs 1,00,000 for any demonstrative product, prototypes, patents, incubated products or services
- Rs 3,00,000 for development of any enterprise based on eligible innovative idea/ products/ services as prize money as a part of state level felicitation.
- Scheme is implemented through OSIC Ltd. So far Rs.36 lakh has been disbursed for 61 project ideas / prototypes.

## 3.7 Organisation of MSME Trade Fair

MSME Trade Fair, 2017" has been organised at IDCO Exhibition Ground, Unit III, Bhubaneswar from 5th – 10th March, 2017 with theme – Startup.

## 3.8.2 Marketing assistance

OKVIB has two Sales Depots at office premises and another at Secretariat, Bhubaneswar. The sals counter of the Board has been renovated with financial assistance of State Government & KVIC.

## 3.8.3 Honey Processing Plant

One manual Honey Processing unit is functioning in the premises of OKVIB. Raw Honey is collected directly from Bee Keepers and Bee Keeping Field men. Besides, there is a proposal for establishment of one mini honey processing plant at Bhubaneswar.

## 3.8.4 Bee Keeping Programme

OKVIB is implementing Bee Keeping Programme throughout the State by imparting free training and providing Bee Boxes at 50% subsidized rate. So far 1120 beneficiaries have been trained and 480 Bee Boxes have been supplied.

#### (i)Marketing Support to Micro Small Enterprises(MSEs)

Being a promotional organization, the Directorate of Export Promotion & Marketing, Odisha, Bhubaneswar is providing marketing assistance to the micro, small enterprises (MSEs) of the State by way of registration of Micro, Small Enterprises (MSEs), conclusion of rate contract with them after assuring the quality of the products manufactured by them .To safeguard the interest of the MSEs as per MSME Development Policy,2016 & Industrial Policy Resolution,2015, the representatives of Directorate of EP&M, Odisha ,Bhubaneswar are attending the Purchase Committee Meetings at the state level for supply of qualitative products to Govt. Departments and agencies under their control at the time of procurement policy programme.

## (iv)Testing of quality of the products manufactured by the MSEs.

Six Testing Laboratories have been established at Cuttack, Rourkela, Angul, Berhampur, Bolangir & Balasore under the administrative control of the Directorate of Export Promotion and Marketing, Odisha, Bhubaneswar.

Before grant of Directorate of EP&M Registration to the MSEs, the samples of store items manufactured by the concerned MSEs are tested in the six testing laboratories under it's control to ascertain the quality of the store items after assuring the quality of the products

manufactured by the MSEs, through periodical inspections, drawal and testing of samples for testing of the products of the Micro, Small Enterprises (MSEs),

In order to supply quality goods to the Government Departments, Pre-delivery Inspection of the store items is being conducted by the Directorate of EP&M on payment of Pre-delivery inspection fees at the rate of 0.5% of the total order value of the store items, & GST etc. from the Government Departments / Offices subordinate to them as leviable thereon as per Central Excise Rules.
